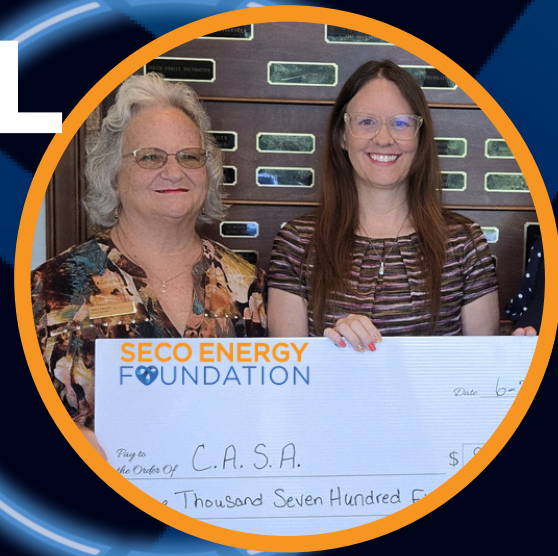
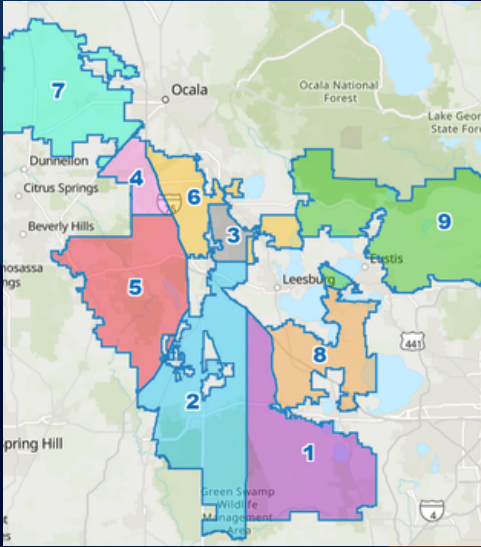

The SECO Energy Foundation awards grants to local non-profits that focus on Health and Human Services, Veteran's Initiatives, the Environment, Education, Public Safety Programs, and Energy-Related Projects. The Foundation is an independent, 501(c)(3) charitable organization, based on the Cooperative Principle of Concern for Community.

## Message from our Foundation Board President:

This year marked an important chapter for the SECO Energy Foundation as we focused on strengthening awareness, accessibility, and connection across the communities we serve.

While grantmaking remains central to our mission, 2025 emphasized ensuring that more nonprofits understood who we are, what we fund, and how we can work together to create meaningful impact.

In 2025, the Foundation awarded 82 grants totaling \$1,093,147 to local nonprofit organizations throughout our service territory. These grants reflect both the generosity of SECO Energy members and the growing reach of the Foundation.
